KMAP GENERAL BULLETIN 21079

Extension for Re-Designation of Tribal Healthcare Facilities as Tribal Federally Qualified Health Centers

Effective with dates of service on or after November 1, 2021, Tribal Healthcare Facilities cannot bill for off-site services as clinic services and cannot be paid for the services at the facility rate, unless the patient is homeless. Tribal healthcare facilities that wish to provide off-site clinic services to members who are not homeless after October 31, 2021, may choose to be a Tribal Federally Qualified Healthcare Center (TFQHC). If the service offered outside the four walls of the TFQHC is a covered Federally Qualified Healthcare Center (FQHC) service, the TFQHC will receive the all-inclusive TFQHC rate for the service.

Tribal Healthcare Facilities enrolled in Medicaid can continue to bill for off-site services as clinic services and be reimbursed at the facility rate through October 31, 2021.

Note: The effective date of the policy is November 1, 2021. The implementation of State policy by the KanCare Managed Care Organizations (MCOs) may vary from the date noted in the Kansas Medical Assistance Program (KMAP) bulletins. The **KanCare Open Claims Resolution Log** on the KMAP [Bulletins](#) page documents the MCO system status for policy implementation and any associated reprocessing completion dates, once the policy is implemented.
